I first of all want to thank all the "Chairpeople" that will make the Cajon Division grow during 1988 (listed on back cover).


As Acting Superintendent I would like to discuss the upcoming Banquet and future activities.

The first layout tour was Mike Hazards's Nevada County Narrow Gauge. It was like stepping back in time 100 years during the time of the Gold Mine "Glory Years" of Nevada County. This fascinating layout was complete with background lighting and sound dimension. (Mike's layout was featured in the NMRA's Bulletin last year).

The second layout was John Hachey's Overland Route. This HO layout features a club size operation which is ideal for those who wish to put their trains to work and run it like the real thing. 
