### THREE MONTHS TO THE 'PACIFIC SOUTHWEST EXPRESS'

Planning for the 2025 Pacific Southwest Region Annual Convention which will be held at the Hilton Irvine - John Wayne Airport is nearly complete. The convention, "Pacific Southwest Express" is scheduled from September 3 through 6, 2025 and will feature modular railroads at the hotel which will include operating sessions, home layout tours, prototype tours, home operating sessions, numerous clinics, Celebration of Models, general interest activities, and an Awards Banquet. There will be opportunities to find something new for your home model railroad from Silent Auction, Swap Meet, Hobo Auction, or the Vendors Booths. We are planning four days packed with model railroad fun.

Prototype Tours include Los Angeles Union Station and the Southern California Railway Museum. In addition to the normal fun at the Southern California Railway Museum, we will be focusing on Santa Fe 5704 which is now at the museum. SCRM will provide a private tour of the museum and an opportunity for you to drive a diesel engine. The Los Angeles Union Station tour includes a behind the scenes tour of areas not open to the public. The original refurbished ticket counters and the original Fred Harvey restaurant will be included in the tour.

There are over 50 Clinics to provide knowledge for members. There are five private model railroads providing Operating Sessions, one modular group at the Hotel and the Riverside Live Steamers. If you have never participated in an operating session, now is the time. If you are interested in some new equipment for your model railroad, we have the Hobo Auction, Silent Auction, Swap Meet and a Vendors Section in the Hilton Hotel.

The convention will end with an Awards Banquet and our guest speaker, Cinthia Priest, Editor NMRA Magazine. The NMRA is celebrating 90 years of service to model railroad enthusiasts this year. As an NMRA member, you want to help celebrate the 90<sup>th</sup> anniversary and join in the fun at the Pacific Southwest Express convention.

### From the Head End

As many of you realize, 2025 marks the 90th anniversary of the NMRA. The predominate scale for model railroads in 1935 was O-scale. At a convention of model railroaders in Milwaukee that year, modelers were encouraged to bring models to operate on various O-scale layouts in the area. Modelers quickly became aware of incompatibilities with each other's models. The publishers of newly launched "Model Railroader" and "Model Craftsman" magazines and others realized that there were no recognized standards for what they thought was an established scale. In the formation of the National Model Railroad Association these pioneers sought to establish standards for equipment compatibility that would make the hobby more enjoyable.

Due to shortages in materials during the war years, the hobby grew slowly. Following the war, returning service men and women found an established hobby ready for their participation. Models and equipment purchased at any store or location was compatible with existing models allowing the hobby to grow. A smaller alternative to O-scale that appeared shortly before the war, HO-scale grew in popularity rapidly from the mid-1950s though the 1960s, primarily because of the standards adopted by the NMRA. Electrical, track, wheel, and coupler standards ensured that models could operate consistently on any layout and HO gradually replace O as the dominate scale.

These scales were joined by N-scale in the late 1960s and Z-scale in the early 1970s rounding out the major scales we still enjoy today. Once again, the NMRA stepped in to establish standards of compatibility early in the development of these scales that would prove essential to their eventual popularity. More recently, it was the NMRA that has pushed for standards for DCC and now LCC that has made it possible for these to have developed and continue to develop as a whole new aspect of operating our models. It is the continuing support of the members of the NMRA that make all this possible. It is the modeling community through the NMRA that have established the standards, not some independent group of manufactures or suppliers.

And let's not forget the modeling aspect of the hobby! Most of us enjoy seeing a favorite locomotive, structure, or scene accurately recreated in miniature and we admire the individuals that are able to create these models. It was for this reason that the Achievement Program was established in 1961 to recognize excellence in modeling. Finally, it is through NMRA sanctioned meetings, gatherings, and conventions that modelers can share their expertise, skills, and knowledge to those of us eager to learn those new skills.

To those Cajon Division members that have been loyal to the NMRA over the years, thank you! There are currently 254 members in the Cajon Division. Of these, 67 have been members for 30 or more years and 27 for more than 50 years. That's more than half the age of the association! However, I know that there are a great many model railroaders out there that don't appreciate the benefits of the NMRA. They maintain that the NMRA doesn't benefit them directly. They say they don't read the NMRA Magazine, attend conventions, participate in the Achievement Program, join clubs, or seldom operate their equipment on other modeler's layouts. They are happy to build their little railroad empires and run their trains. But it is 90 years of the NMRA that allows them to enjoy the hobby at all.

So, if you are one of those that don't think the NMRA is for you, think about the advancements in the hobby over the last 90 years and what it would be like without the NMRA. Then think about what you can Continued next page


### On the Road Again Special Edition

I will be releasing a Special Edition Supplemental Order Board covering my visit to the 2025 Pittsburgh Model Railroad Jamboree in May sponsored by Division 2 of NMRA's Mid-Central Region. The Jamboree included clinics and local area layout tours. I went on a full day of layout tours and took plenty of photos!

### **Product Review**

I recently purchased four HO 1966 F-Series Pickup Truck models from Showcase Miniatures. They were produced by 3D Printing. The truck is in two pieces, the body and the frame/chassis/interior. That makes them easier to paint. There is no window glass provided. The surfaces are quite smooth, unlike some other 3D models I have purchased where the build layers are not as fine resulting in 'steps' or ridges in the surfaces that requires additional sanding. The material is thick enough such that rough handling is not an issue. There are a few small areas of remaining flash that need to be cleaned up, but the surfaces should take paint well. I would recommend washing the model in warm soapy water prior to painting to remove any surface contaminants. Each model came individually packaged in separate clear plastic cases.

Showcase Miniatures has a large assortment of vehicles of various model years and other items in HO, N, Z and S scales. Showcase also offers an NMRA discount of 10% for members, just use code NMRA10member at checkout. Free shipping for orders over \$75. The Pacific Southwest Express planning is well under way and the convention will have something for everyone.

Do you like to see home model railroads to learn how the owner has accomplished something that you like? Do you like to learn new ideas from the home model railroad owners? If yes, we will have numerous home model railroads to visit and learn directly from the owner. Many of the home model railroads will be self-drive, (you can team up with a friend) and one guided tour of home model railroads. We will have several modular railroads set up at the convention for viewing and learning something new.

Do you like Operating Sessions? We have four home model railroads committed to run operating sessions and one modular club that will run operating sessions at the Convention Center.

The Pacific Southwest Express will offer several opportunities to acquire something new for your model railroad. Several vendors are planning to set up at the convention which will provide the opportunity to purchase the latest in model railroading. Of course, we will have the Hobo Auction and Swap Meet to allow you to decide which items you cannot live without. Another new feature will be a Silent Auction which will allow attendees to decide how much they would like to pay to add something new to their collection.

Clinics are always a big hit among attendees. Our clinics will provide historical information, knowledge on building all phases of a model railroad, and prototype information. We are planning for over 80 clinics presented by modelers, historians, manufacturers and MMRs with the most popular being presented twice. Stephen Priest will present a clinic on the restoration of SF 5704, an SD45-2, to the 1976 paint scheme. We will all learn the importance of the Pre-Order portion of the process. In total, 294 requests for a clinic have been sent to previous presenters. I am sure you will find some clinics that will be of interest to you.

If you like Prototype Tours, we have something for you. The Southern California Railway Museum has the West's largest collection of railway locomotives, passenger cars, street cars, and interurban electric cars. The tour will include SF 5704, which was refurbished to the 1976 paint scheme. If you always wanted to drive a diesel engine, this tour will provide the opportunity.

The Los Angeles Union Station is the main railway station in Los Angeles and the largest railroad passenger terminal in the Western United States. This is a behind the scenes tour that includes the historic ticket counter and the original Fred Harvey Restaurant. Los Angeles Union Station is included on the National Register of Historical Places.

Celebration of Models is always my favorite portion of our conventions. We will include all the "normal" categories for viewing and evaluation. In addition, there will be a special contest for a one square foot model. The model must be no larger than one foot square and not over two feet high. The model must include track and/or a freight car. Photographs and Arts and Crafts will also be included in the model contest.

We will end the convention with an Awards Banquet and our Keynote Speaker, Cinthia Priest, Senior Editor NMRA Magazine. Since 2025 is the 90the Anniversary of the NMRA, I am sure Cinthia will include some of the key events in the development of the NMRA. She may also hit the highlights of her Destination MMR articles.
