From the Desk of the Director

Gary Stenberg, Cajon Division Director



Season's greetings to all. 2025 was quite a year. We had twelve Board of Director's meetings where the Superintendent and all the Chair positions discussed and planned for the Division. We had a spring meet and hosted the Pacific Southwest Region's annual convention this past fall in Irvine. We had layout tours and published several editions of the Order Board. All-in-all, we did pretty well. But. We can do better.

Perhaps you've heard of the new NMRA rebranding effort. It is not just presenting us with a new LOGO, but with a business model approach to providing more for the membership. The NMRA national powers-that-be published four key standards that are:

Effective Division Operation: This standard focuses on the foundational structure and consistent communication needed for a division to function smoothly and professionally.

Member/Modeler Skill Growth: This standard focuses on providing opportunities for members to enhance their skills, gain recognition, and deepen their involvement in the hobby.

Building the Organization: This standard focuses on growing NMRA membership, fostering a welcoming community, and maintaining ties with the national organization.

Public Outreach & Visibility: This standard focuses on sharing the hobby with the public, attracting new interest, and ensuring model railroading has a visible presence in the community.

The first part of that model is to enact Division Level Standards, which the members of the Board of the Cajon Division must perform to. The good news for the Board is that most of the requirements are things that we are already doing. The requirements start with leadership.

LEADERSHIP: At the beginning of 2025, the following positions were held: Paul Stoner - Superintendent, Craig McCormick - Assistant Superintendent – Nevada, Harold Helland – Director, Gary Stenberg - Chief Clerk, Robert Calicchia – Paymaster, Patrick Rogan - Membership Chair, Kurt Matthews - Publications / Editor of Order Board, Gary Butts - Achievement Program Chair, Dan Moran – Social Media Chair – Webmaster, Mike Allee - Contest Chair, and Brian Neely - Donation Acquisition Chair. Throughout the year some changes occurred. Dan Moran resigned as social media chair / webmaster after holding the position for quite some time and doing a fine job at it. In September, Director Harold Helland was “timed out” as Director and Gary Stenberg (me) was elected to the position. Since I could not be the

Director and the Chief Clerk at the same time, the clerk's position had to be filled. Steve Cole was appointed to the position of Chief Clerk in September. Just before Thanksgiving, tragedy struck as Steve passed away unexpectedly. The Chief Clerk position is currently unfilled. At the end of the year, and having served the Division well, Patrick Rogan is stepping down as Membership Chair. As we enter into 2026, we are looking for some qualified people to volunteer to serve.

PLANNING: The goals established by the NMRA will require us to implement several items and to keep track of what we have done. So, we will develop an annual action plan. We will conduct regional support meetings. We'll adopt and review our By-Laws and Manual of Operations. There will be a regular election for Superintendent this fall. The Superintendent will appoint people to the various committees and positions (see the list above). Our Publications Chair will maintain an active website and publish the Order Board at least four times a year. Our Social Media Chair will participate in Facebook and other social media sites as needed. We will hold regular meetings of the Board and of the regular membership. Participation in the Achievement Certificate Program will be encouraged. We also hope to have more layout tours hosted by our membership. The list goes on and on.

PARTICIPATION: The second and third key standards established by the NMRA for the divisions cannot be met without you. The Board members take great delight in seeing their organizing efforts benefitting you the member when you attend and participate. Our meets have had great clinics (classroom lectures and stuff) and we're thinking of some clinics where you build a model under the watchful eye and guidance of a Master Model Railroader. We are also looking into possible meets at Riverside Live Steamers (fully functional live steam model trains that you can ride behind.) On the radar too is a meet at the Southern California Railroad Museum in Perris. Planning for your participation starts now!!!

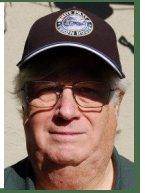

End of the Siskiyou Line?

The Southern Pacific Siskiyou Line ran from Weed, CA to Portland, OR. It was built in the late 1880s and served as SP's main trunk route to Portland from California until the Natron cutoff was completed in 1927 from Weed to Eugene, OR via Klamath Falls, OR. The Natron cutoff serves as the current UP main line and hosts Amtrak's Coast Starlight.

The Siskiyou Line consisted of many tunnels, curves and steep grades between Weed and Ashland, OR. The Natron cutoff was built to newer standards with gentler grades. After the Natron cutoff opened, the Siskiyou Line became less important as a through route from California to Oregon.

Shortline Central Oregon & Pacific, a Genesee & Wyoming company, eventually assumed ownership of the Siskiyou Line from Weed to Eugene. The Roseburg Forest Products Plant in Weed was the only significant customer south of Ashland. Roseburg Forest has announced the Weed plant is scheduled for closure. This portion of the line had been closed before due to lack of on-line customers and the amount of maintenance needed for the many bridges and tunnels. The disposition of the line has not yet been officially announced.

The Great Allegheny Railroad Passage by Kurt Reisweber

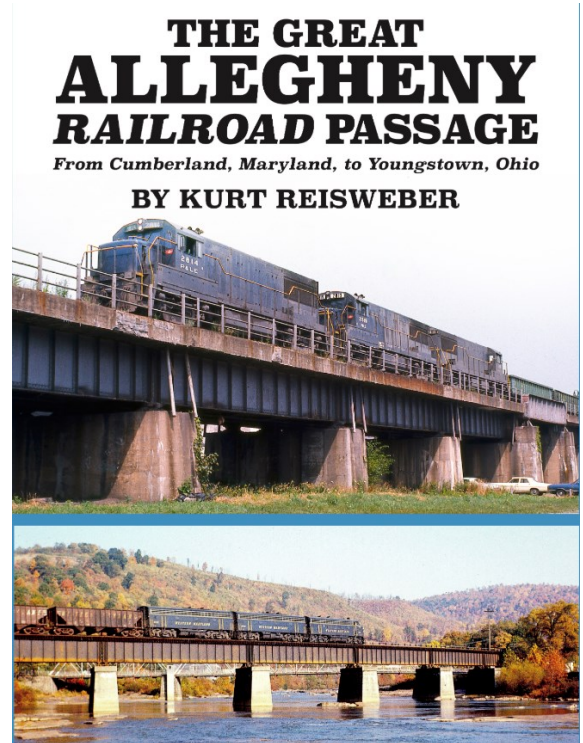
I purchased this book recently. I have family from the area of coverage within this book. As I youngster, we used to pass through Connellsville, PA on the way to Uniontown to visit grandparents. I was always amazed at the number of railroads that passed through the small hamlet including B&O, P&LE, WM, PRR and P&WV later NW. Only the B&O, regional W&LE and short-line Southwest Pennsylvania Railroad (a Carload Express road) remain. SWP uses the ex-PRR/B&O lines from a connection at Radebaugh on the NS Pittsburgh mainline south to Fairchance, PA. It mainly hauls frac sand for the local oil industry.

The Allegheny Passage is the name of the rail/trail that runs from Pittsburgh to Washington, DC using abandoned rail lines. The trail utilizes the ex-P&LE Connellsville branch from McKeesport to Connellsville then the ex-WM mainline to Cumberland, MD and beyond.

The book has a chapter each on the B&O, WM and P&LE and has many color photos of the railroads in the 1970s-1980s along with a large collection of railroad post cards of the same area. There are also plenty of maps tracing each individual railroad and its branches. The route follows the Youghiogheny River from its end point in McKeesport, PA into the Monongahela River, eastward to Confluence, PA, then up to the Caselman River to Sand Patch Summit (B&O) and Deal Summit (WM) and into Maryland and on to Cumberland, MD.

The book is well written and easy to read. Although I have to admit, knowing the area helps, but I did learn many details about some of the local branches, especially Bowest outside Connellsville, where the B&O and WM met in Dunbar, PA. This area was quite a mystery to me personally, since most of the lines were gone by the time I had a driver's license in order to explore. The WM line was abandoned in 1975 after Chessie was formed, and I got my license in 1978.

If you are interested in the B&O, P&LE and WM, I would recommend the book. At a \$65 list price, its a bit expensive for a soft-cover in my opinion, but I was able to purchase it through a dealer at a discount. Total pages are 154, and the photo quality is very good. Maps and station lists are a plus too.

Well.....maybe not so much. Before my father passed away, he let me ship out the 3-rail Lionel set he was given at Christmas from his parents somewhere (I think) around 1940. He would have been 8 years old. He had the tender whistle repaired a number of years ago and the engine still runs. I did give the wheels and power pickups a good cleaning. I had to buy a new power pack, for when I went to Milepost 38 Trains (to see if the original one could be repaired) they told me "Get rid of that thing! Are you trying to burn your house down??" I set this 'layout' out for the holiday's every other year, alternating with the HO-Scale Aurora Thunderjet slot car track I had as a child.

For all of you (including Brian Neely), who wonder what I do with all the O-Gauge stuff I win at the Hobo Auction (only because no one else bids).....Behold!
