### From the Brass Hat

This is my last "From The Brass Hat" column to you, as I will be stepping down as Cajon Division Superintendent at the upcoming Buena Park Event on October 19<sup>th</sup>, when the new Superintendent takes over. As of my writing this column, the new Superintendent is unknown, but I wish him or her great success and satisfaction in their efforts to improve the Cajon Division.

My 5-year tenure as Superintendent began because of the previous Superintendent's resignation of the position short of the completion of his term. At the time, I was the Cajon Treasurer and happy to stay Treasurer, with no intent of moving into the Superintendent job, when two Cajon Board members approached me and asked me to serve the organization in a new way. Considering my belief that the NMRA brings value to the membership and as a member of this organization, I would get out of it what I give, I had no choice but to agree. And I'm glad that I did!

So what did I get out of my tenure as the Superintendent? The experience has been challenging and very positive, overall. The best part of it has been that being Superintendent required me to make the effort to meet members at every opportunity I had, whether at open houses, train shows, our Buena Park events or when at the hobby shop. I made it my business (and my "duty") to introduce myself to new and existing members and try to learn a bit about them and where their passion for the hobby lies, and in the process, I made some friends and met some interesting people. Of course, I also got an opportunity to work with a terrific Board of Directors, and I thank them for their support in my goals for the organization and their efforts to improve the experience of every member of the Cajon Division.

During my time as Superintendent we experienced the Covid Pandemic. Unfortunately, we had to cancel a few events at the beginning of this era, but we managed to adapt, improvise and overcome, holding "minimal contact" Buena Park Events, where we substituted new outdoor activities for inside activities. At that first event, we initiated the Cajon Connection, where we shared modeling information around tables outside in the courtyard which worked out well. We also held the Hobo Auction partially outside, which didn't work out so well, due to wind blowing over the cups, but we adapted for the next event, and weighed down the cups with stones. At that event, we also started the "Modelers' Show and Tell", which gave those members who brought models for display or Merit Award consideration, the opportunity to tell the group about their models. Also during the Pandemic, since we couldn't meet in person, the Board decided to publish the Order Board magazine every month, and we did this for more than a year. (The need to write a lot of articles during that period accelerated me getting my Author Achievement Certificate, and I don't think I'm the only one.)

Quite a bit has occurred during my tenure, and I won't bore you by listing them. I hope my efforts as Superintendent have improved the value of your membership in the Cajon Division. It has been my honor and privilege to have served the membership in this way. I hope to continue to bring value to the Pacific Southwest Region as a whole as I transition into the PSR President position.

### The Backshop

The big PSR push for the National Convention is behind us now and by all accounts was a great success. In spite of the lack of the normal large venue for the National Train Show and all of the bigger vendors that it attracts, everyone I had contact with was more than satisfied with the event. It takes an amazing amount of work to put this convention together and our convention team is to be congratulated for doing such a fine job.

Although the contest room evaluators seemed a little stingy with the AP Merit awards, our Region walked away with the bulk of the contest plaques across all model categories. There were some fantastic models in the celebration room and It seems we, here in the PSR, can build some nice models when we want to.

Of course, before the dust even has settled, we are into the early stages of preparing for our 2025 Pacific Southwest Region Convention. Committee slots are open for anyone interested in helping out and earning some Achievement Program volunteer credits in the process. Contact our Cajon Division Director, Harold Helland, to see how you can get involved.

The question came up again the other day relative to the requirement for the Master Builder Cars Achievement Program Certificate. It can be a bit confusing. The basic requirement to receive the certificate is easy enough: accumulate eight cars representing four different types of rolling stock that have been evaluated and meet the qualifications that follow. At least four of these eight cars must have evaluated out at Merit Award level at an NMRA event or by special evaluation session arranged by an NMRA Division AP chairman. Copies of the Merit Award Certificates should accompany the Cars AP application. In addition to the Merit Award requirements, four of the eight qualified cars must have been scratch-built by the member seeking the certificate. The confusion seems to come from the mis-understanding that these Merit and Scratch cars need to be separate cars. Yes you need eight qualified cars, but it is a Mix and Match situation.

It is OK if not all four of your scratch-built cars make Merit level evaluation as long as enough of your nonscratch (kit?) built cars evaluate at Merit level to make up the total to be four Merits within the eight cars submitted. To meet the NMRA requirement that all submitted cars should be of "Merit Award" quality, the traditional PSR minimum evaluation requirement for a Cars Statement of Qualification is 60 points. So, if you super-detail four kit cars and add enough scratch built details and do a good job of assembly, etc. and receive Merit awards for them, your four scratch built cars need only evaluate above the 60 point level to make up your eight car total and qualify for the certificate. For instance, my personal submittal years ago included four scratch built cars but only three were awarded Merit. However, two of my four kit-built cars did receive Merits so that gave me the four scratch and five merits award cars I needed. Of course, it is usually easier to evaluate at the Merit award level with the complexity of scratch building and four or five scratch built cars that make merit take the pressure off of the remaining as long as they can qualify with 60 or more evaluation points.



### **Upcoming Layout Tour**

### **December 7, 2024**

While railfanning the Yosemite Park area, a Shay locomotive cab ride through the forest with whistle blaring and headlight beaming through the trees served as the inspiration for the Union Pacific Sugar Pine Sub garage HO Scale layout. To have model train whistles blaring and headlights shining thru the scale 100-foot -tall trees, presents quite a design challenge.

The layout is still in the construction phase so you will be able to observe our construction and scenery techniques. The use of foam, dirt, mountains, trees, riverbed with running water are some of the design goals. There are numerous photo opportunities around the four bridges, six single tunnel portals, one double tunnel portal, riverbed (with running water... hopefully) and a small town with a six-track yard for yard jobs and industrial switching. Future plans are for a lumber yard and an engine facility.

The layout will be open to members of the Cajon Division of the NMRA on December 7, 2024 from 10AM to 2PM at 2302 N. Glenwood St. in Orange, CA. Your host is Terry Howden. Light refreshments will be served. Hope to see everyone there for a great layout and a great get together.

### The Editor's Column

I had the privilege of being 'bus captain' for the Metrorail/GEMCO Yard Tour during the SurfLiner Convention. Both locations were very informative.

#### Metrorail

The Metrorail facility is located on S. Santa Fe Ave. just north of the Fourth St. Bridge in downtown Los Angeles. It is on the site of the old AT&SF Los Angeles Passenger Station (pre-Union Station) and coach yard along the west side of the river. Our tour was led by Bob Spadafora, Sr. Executive Officer and Andrew "AJ" Chier, Director of Rail Fleet Services. The facility maintains and upgrades the former Metro Red Line Subway cars that run from Union Station to N. Hollywood. I believe it is now referred to as the B-Line. These cars are classified as 'heavy rail' and run off third rail power in lieu of overhead catenary. The first delivered cars date from the 1990s and are being retired and replaced with all new cars. The later delivered series of original cars are being refurbished with a life expectancy of another 15 years. Upgrades include new seating that is more easily cleaned, new signage and stainless steel panels on the inner walls to defer graffiti. We were able to go inside both an older refurbished car and a brand new car. The cars are relatively simple, consisting of a body, control station, trucks and electric motors. We also were shown the wheel press/ profiler machine. The facility performs its own wheel work. Our thanks to Bob and AJ for conducting an informative tour.

#### **GEMCO** Yard

GEMCO Yard is located in Van Nuys at the site of the now extinct General Motors Plant (hence the nickname). The yard serviced the GM plant, a Budweiser Brewery to the north (still active) and a Stroh's Brewery across from the GM plant at what now is the site of the Metrolink Station. Like most of Southern California industry, the GM plant site is now a shopping center. Ghosts of the tracks leading into the plant still exist in the pavement at the fence line. The yard was originally Southern Pacific, but is now Union Pacific. An excellent source and a write up of the yard's history can be found in the book <u>Southern Pacific Lines Los</u> <u>Angeles Division</u> by John R. Signor. The yard now serves local industries and as the origination/termination point of the Guadalupe Turn. This train takes cars to Guadalupe Yard near Santa Maria and connects with the Santa Maria Valley Railroad. Traffic includes lumber, frozen produce, fertilizer, propane and petroleum coke.

We were able to watch the yard shifters move cars to make up the Guadalupe Turn train. The yard shifters also had an ex-SP bay window caboose utilized as a shoving platform. It was a virtual copy of the Athearn Blue Box HO model including the flying saucer antenna and the 'frog-eye' marker light housing on the roof. The Turn was assembled off of two yard tracks by the road power, backed to the east end of the yard to reach the main and went by us going west at track speed. That made for great photos and videos.

Our special thanks to Mike Osborne, a UP conductor, who acted as our tour guide, not only at GEMCO, but on the entire bus ride up and back pointing out various rail facilities and lines along the way. Mike also arranged for the tour of the yard itself. All of the UP employees we met were very friendly and informative.

On another note, I wanted to recognize all the Cajon Board Members who tirelessly supported SurfLiner both before and at the conference every day. And a special thanks to Joel Morse for his service as the Cajon Division Superintendent these past years. Thanks gents!

### **Cajon Division Fall Meet Model Awards**

There are two ways in which one can enter an item in the Celebration Room, as an item for evaluation, using NMRA guidelines, with the possibility of receiving a Merit Award, or as an item entered for "Display" and not to be evaluated. A Merit Award is one step in earning the title of Master Model Railroader (MMR<sup>®</sup>). All items in the Celebration Room are automatically entered into the People's Choice Award category.

Some of the categories may only have one, two or no entries. A modeler could have received a certificate for first, second or third place, possibly a Merit Award, if they had entered a model. Do you have models that would place in the categories, but you're a little apprehensive about showing your skills to fellow modelers? At the division meet it's just modelers of the local area. The models are identified by number, the modeler's name doesn't appear. The only time a name would be associated with the model is when a modeler receives an award for their modeling ability. A personally proud moment.


